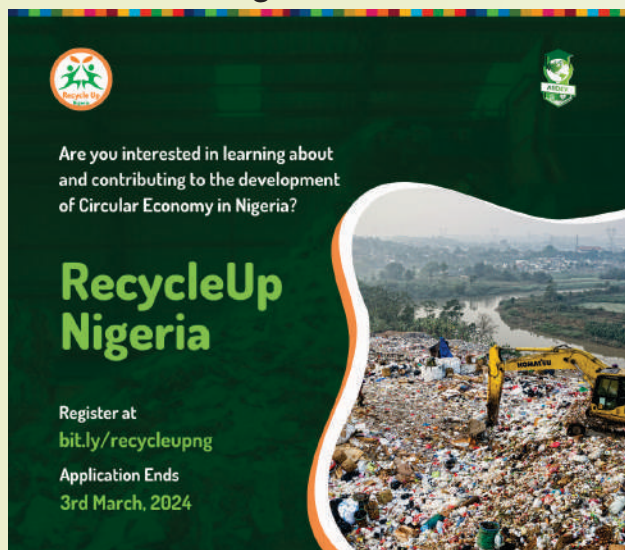


RecycleUP Nigeria

Nigeria is a nation with a rich cultural heritage and diverse landscapes, yet it faces a daunting challenge of excessive waste production. According to UNIDO, Nigeria generates an astounding 32 million tonnes of waste annually, of which 2.5 million tonnes are plastic waste. This not only poses a threat to the natural environment but also to the health and well-being of the populace. RecycleUp Nigeria offers a glimmer of hope and development in the midst of this crisis.

RecycleUp Nigeria is a 6-month innovation programme that seeks to empower and nurture young innovators and entrepreneurs who are environmentally conscious, providing them with the knowledge, resources, and support required to address Nigeria's waste problem and catalyze the transition towards a circular economy.

The programme aims to drive the transition towards a circular economy in Nigeria by 200% by 2025. The initiative focuses on key sectors, including Built Environment, Organic Material and Biowaste, Energy, Electronics and ICT, Packaging and Plastics, Textiles, Water, and Food and Agriculture.

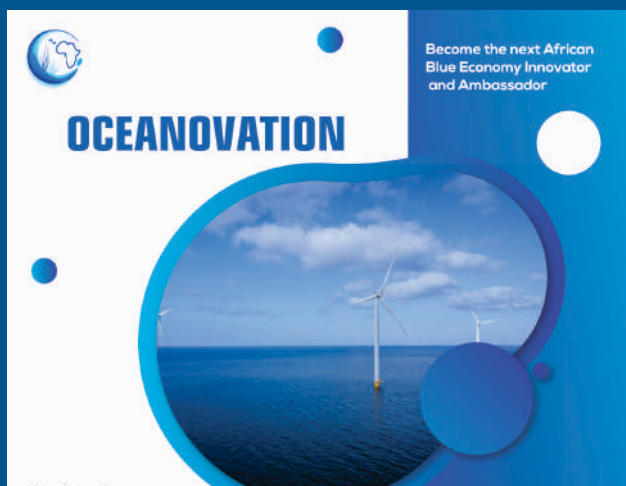
